- 1) Call to Order Shaheen (PFC President)
 - Meeting called to order; agenda reviewed.

2) PFC Board Introductions

• Board members introduced; reminders on how to contact leads for clubs, events, comms, and budget questions.

3) Club Advisory / Activities Director Role - Ms. Natalie Young

- Clubs initiated by CCS students fall under the school initiated club and the contact for those is Natalie Young.
- Clubs must be student-initiated and have a cleared adult advisor (teacher, certificated staff, or cleared volunteer). Students secure the advisor; Activities director does not place advisors.
- Submit the club form → reviewed by student leaders → final approval once an advisor is confirmed. Please don't publicize until fully approved.
- Room use: if the advisor is a teacher, they may host in their classroom; if the advisor is a non-teacher volunteer, coordinate space via Danielle.
- Outside providers (non-CK8 students/entities) go through district facilities rental.
- Interest in an Elementary Toastmasters offering is welcomed, same advisor/approval process applies. Quality over quantity so we protect adult capacity and sustain clubs.
- PFC Youth Enrichment Clubs are led by High school students and are coordinated with PFC. PFC will take care of facilities request and club can be stated based on the facilities availability.

4) Principal's Update — Dr. Theo (CCS Principal)

- School start & logistics: school began Aug 12; master schedule adjustments completed; a parking/visitor plan is being developed.
- Inclusion model: shift toward educating more special ed learners in general ed with supports; some special ed students join general ed classes (ex: art/PE).
 Training for staff is planned this month. Expect some adjustment period while supports are put in place.
- **Student voice:** Principal will launch a monthly advisory with 8-10 middle schoolers to inform decisions.

5) School Site Council (SSC)

- SSC met last week; focus on facilities/budget accountability and principal updates.
- 5th-grade Science Camp: Tue Sep 30–Fri Oct 3 (earlier timing to build classroom bonds).

Middle school dance this Friday; primary grade assessments underway.

6) Community Engagement & Events

- Great turnout for Coffee with the Principal and Ice-Cream Social (new music/dance elements were a hit). Feedback survey results will be shared.
- Consider a simple TK/K family meet-up (picnic/non orientation-style) to help new families connect.
- Haunted Hall and Trunk or Treat returns, our signature fall event!

7) Budget & Fundraising

- Fall Check-In goal: internal target \$60,000; current received ~\$51,000. Please submit employer matching forms (you can still file matches on prior donations).
- Allocations: funds cover enrichment programs, teacher stipends, grants, events, etc.; carryover reserve maintained.
- IXL renewal: district no longer funds site-wide. Quoted ~\$9.8k for 1-8. Principal will negotiate a discount and explore cost-sharing so we don't pull from teacher grade-level funds or cancel assemblies.

8) Enrichment & Programs (status)

- ExtraMath (elementary) active.
- Flocabulary (grades 2-6) active; invoice pending.

- Scholastic (TK-5) renews in October.
- "BrainPop" (K–2) running (as referenced in the meeting).
- Assemblies: Fire Truck (TK-1, late Sept) and Astronomy (December) show scheduled.

Athletics & Activities

- Basketball is staffed; volleyball coach recruiting in progress.
- Athletic Director transition: interim coverage in place; a candidate is in process.
- Interest in bringing back Swing Dance units now that the gym is open.

Dr T: Have to be mindful of capacity and who is involved. And it is not purposeful to have 80 clubs, etc.		
For Toastmasters - Space goes through Danielle.
